L. Westerman :

“ I attended the May 2024 Henllys Community Council meeting to request bus shelters be provided in Henllys. The following is taken from the HCC May 2024 minutes-

L. Westerman requested the assistance of HCC in providing bus shelters at the stops by the Village Hall & by Llys Gwyrdd .

Cllr Thomas agreed to pursue this matter with TCBC .

D Leech also offered to pursue the matter .

Since over 8 months have elapsed with no visible result I would like to attend the February Henllys Community Council meeting to receive an update on this request. “

Response from TCBC :

“ funding for all bus shelters, whether new or replacement shelters are funded through Welsh Government grants. At present we are not in position to confirm whether or not shelters at these locations can be funded but they will be logged for future consideration.

The cost for new shelters and installation can vary, depending on the specifications. In general, the cheapest option would start at around £10,000 and can rise anywhere to £20,000 / £25,000 depending on the variations. These costs are inclusive of installation. “

In view of the unsatisfactory response Cllr's Thomas & Burnett will seek further info from TCBC .
